**Cover:** The image of the Crab Nebula, taken by NASA's Hubble Space Telescope, is a remnant of a supernova explosion in 1054 AD, when Chinese and Japanese astronomers, and likely Native Americans too, were startled by the appearance of a new star, so bright that it could be seen in broad daylight for several weeks. The orange filaments are the tattered remains of the star and are mostly hydrogen. The neutron star, embedded in the center, powers the nebula's eerie bluish glow that comes from electrons whirling at nearly the speed of light. The Crab Nebula derived its name from its appearance in a drawing made by Irish astronomer, Lord Rosse, in 1844, using a 36-inch telescope.
